10am Prompt Start.

Run under 2 phase competition rules – First section untimed, proceed straight in to timed jump off section.

Rosettes 1st – 6th Place.

Junior and senior sections, members collect points throughout the season for end of year trophies.

Class 1 – Show jumping 60cms

Class 2 – Show jumping 70cms

Class 3 – Show jumping 75cms

Class 4 – Show jumping 80cms

Class 5 – Show jumping 90cms

Class 6 – Show jumping 1.00m

Main Ring Showing - 9:30am Prompt Start

Rosettes 1-6th Place. Members collect points for end of year trophies for each class and ★ STARS ★ Qualification.

Class 7 – Best Turned Out

Open to all, junior or senior including lead rein. Judged on cleanliness and presentation of horse and rider. Competitors will not be required to do an individual show. STARS Qualifier.

Class 8 – Senior Equitation (Best Rider)

Rider exceeding 18 years of age. Judged on the rider's use of the aids, position and overall impression. Snaffle bridle preferred. STARS Qualifier.

Class 9 – Open Ridden Show Horse

Exceeding 15hh. Open to hack, riding horse and cob types. STARS Qualifier.

Class 10 – Ridden Veteran

Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height aged 15 years or over. STARS Qualifier.

Class 11 – Riding Club Horse/Pony

Judged on suitability for riding club activities. Optional jump in individual show. STARS Qualifier, ponies not exceeding 148cms, horses exceeding 148cms.

Class 12 – Racehorse to Riding Horse

Open to Retraining of Racehorses registered Ex-Racers. STARS Qualifier.

Class 13 – Ridden Hunter

Exceeding 15hh. Open to all hunter types. STARS Qualifier.

Combinations placed first or second in classes 7-13 are eligible to compete in the ridden championship on conclusion of class 13. Trophy and sash to champion combination.

Entry Fee - Members £6 - Non Members £9 - On the Day (Cash only) £10

Main Ring Working Hunter

Not Before 12pm, on conclusion of ridden showing championship

Rosettes 1-6th Place. Members collect points for end of year trophies for each class and ★ STARS ★ Qualification.

Class 14 – Lead Rein / Tiny Tots Working Hunter

Any combination welcome, but in order to be eligible for qualify for STARS for ponies must not exceeding 128cms, LR jumps 30cms, Tiny tots assisted jumps 40cms. Class will be split if sufficient entries, STARS points awarded according to section.

Class 15 – 50cms Working Hunter

Any combination welcome, not a STARS qualifier, ADRC class only.

Class 16 – 65cms Working Hunter

Any combination welcome, but in order to be eligible for qualify for STARS you must meet the following criteria – plaited ponies not exceeding 13hh, M&M ponies not exceeding 133cm

Class 17 – 75cms Working Hunter

Any combination welcome, but in order to be eligible for qualify for STARS you must meet the following criteria – plaited or hogged ponies exceeding 133cms not exceeding 153cms, M&M exceeding 133cms.

Class 18 – 85cms Working Hunter

Any combination welcome, but in order to be eligible for qualify for STARS you must meet the following criteria – plaited or hogged horses exceeding 153cms.

Combinations placed first or second in classes 14-18 are eligible to compete in the ridden championship on conclusion of class 13. Trophy and sash to champion combination.

10am Start Prompt.

Rosettes 1-6th Place. Members collect points for end of year trophies for each class and ★ STARS ★ Qualification.

Class 19 – Open In hand

Open to all types and ages Stallions and colts must be shown in a bridle STARS Qualifier for relevant in hand class

Class 20 – Best Handler

Judged on the handler's ability to present the horse/pony. Junior combinations eligible for STARS qualification. Tiny tots 4-7yrs, pony not exceeding 128cms, Young Handler 8-11 years, Junior Handler 12-17years.

Class 21 – In hand Plaited Horse or Pony

Open to all types and ages that would be shown plaited. Stallions and colts must be shown in a bridle STARS qualifie

Class 22 – Best Lead Rein Pony and Rider.

All combinations welcome. To be eligible to qualify for STARS riders must not have attained their 10th birthday before the 1st January 2024 and ponies must not exceed 128cms, plaited & M&M combinations welcome. STARS qualifier for lead rein equitation and best lead rein pony.

Class 23 – Ridden Novice

Horse/pony and rider combination not to have been placed first in any showing class. Competitors will not be expected to canter altogether on the go round but may to choose to in their individual show. Not a STARS qualifier.

Class 24 – Best First Ridden Pony and Rider

All combinations welcome. To be eligible to qualify for STARS riders must not have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January 2024 and ponies must not exceed 128cms, plaited & M&M combinations welcome. STARS qualifier for first ridden equitation and best first ridden pony.

Class 25 – Best Ridden Pony and Rider

Open to ridden show pony or show hunter pony types, not exceeding 153cms. STARS qualifier for ridden show pony and show hunter pony.

Class 26 – Junior Equitation (Best Rider)

All combinations welcome, riders not to have attained 18th birthday before 1st January 2024. STARS Qualifier

Class 27 – Open Ridden Mountain and Moorland

Open to lead rein, small and large breeds. STARS qualifier.

Combinations placed first or second in classes 19-27 are eligible to compete in the mini ring championship on conclusion of class 27. Trophy and sash to champion combination.

CLASS 45 – The SSA EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. **Southernden Farm** offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette in memory of **The Late Mr R Philpot** is offered to the Adult Member and **Just So Elegant Side Saddle Hire** to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

A Special rosette will be offered to the Adult Member, carrying their current Championship Points Card, of the **SSA Area in which the Show is organised**, who during the Equitation Qualifier Class (irrespective of final placing) is judged to be the most elegant. That member will be eligible to compete in the Final for the **Sir Lancelot Memorial Trophy** (donated by the late Mrs E. Skelton) at the National Side Saddle Show. A Member may only qualify once per season between one National Show and the next, and if the Judge's first choice has already qualified, the rosette will be awarded to the next eligible competitor. The highest placed rider aged 45 years or over will receive the Constance, Lady Bayliss memorial rosette.

CLASS 46 – BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. **Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.**

The Highest placed **coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16 years or over** (who has not already qualified) receives a **Special Rosette** and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the **CHAPS Championship Show**. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to

compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed. Combinations qualifying after the current year's CHAPS Final may carry forward the qualification, to the following year.

CLASS 47 – THE SIDE SADDLE ASSOCIATION CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER

Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners and & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider. Judges may request a short show, but exhibits; but horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted.

Judges must use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, the Qualification Card may be passed down to fourth place. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be the winner. If the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. *Qualifiers kindly sponsored by Mrs. T. Mitchell and Mr. L. Mitchell.* Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. The four highest placed **Riding Horse, Hack (not ex 160cm), Cob or Hunter**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualify for the current year's **BSHA Championship Show Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship** and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. **SSA Members who qualify for The Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA** in order to compete in any **Side Saddle class** at the **BSHA National Championship Show**. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the Championship.

CLASS 48 THE SIDE SADDLE ASSOCIATION CONTEMPORARY LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER

Open to SSA Adult and Junior Members and Non-members riding a Native, Part Bred, Heavy or World Breed horse/pony side saddle. To be judged 25% suitability of horse/pony for rider, 25% manners and way of going for type, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider. Conformation will not be taken into consideration. The Judge will request a short show. Traditional habits must be worn. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying

combination at each show, this may not always be the winner; if the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. *Qualifiers kindly sponsored by Southernden Side Saddles* Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only.

CLASS 49 - COSTUME SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS D'ÉLÉGANCE

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. Competitors should produce a brief résumé about their costumes for the Commentator.

CHAMPIONSHIP

All 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 45 - 49 are eligible to compete.

A Champion and Reserve Champion Rosette and Sash will be awarded by Sharnford Tractors Limited.

AREA 5 QUALIFIERS & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

ADRC are proud to send teams to area qualifiers throughout the calendar year in dressage, show jumping, horse trials and arena eventing. Junior and senior members who regularly compete at club shows, volunteer to help at set up or on show days and/or attend club training may be selected to represent ADRC on area teams and maybe even qualify to compete at BRC National Championships. You must be a full BRC affiliated member of ADRC. Speak to team managers Heather Wyles (HT), Judith Moreton (Dressage) or Hayley Warren (SJ) for more info, and keep an eye on Facebook for news on qualifiers.

ADRC Rules

This competition is run in accordance with British Riding Club Rules. Correct riding dress must be worn appropriate to each class and at all times when mounted. A correctly fitting hat conforming to PAS015 and BSEN1384 and carrying the BSI kitemark must be worn at all times when mounted. If competing in jumping classes, hair must be securely fastened above shoulder length.

Non-members must hold their own insurance.

Horses and ponies must be fully vaccinated against equine flu to attend this event (12 months vaccination).

Rosettes awarded 1st -6th in all classes. Classes may be amalgamated if insufficient entries or split if large entries as appropriate.

It is the rider's responsibility to be at the ring for the start of the class or designated time where appropriate. Whilst all efforts are made to avoid clashes, classes will not be held, and competitors will not be allowed to enter the show ring once the class has started without the judge's permission. For dressage and show jumping classes, where you suspect a clash may occur, please speak to the ring stewards in good time who will make reasonable effort to facilitate your requests, the judge's decision is final.

Entries are preferred in advance via Equoevents.co.uk. On the day entries may be taken if space permits at £10 class, payment by cash only, with the exception of the dressage which is strictly pre entry only. Entries may close before the closing date if entries are deemed to be full or at the organiser's discretion.

All ages are taken from 1st January 2024.

Members will accumulate points for end of season awards if placed 1st to 6th.

Colts and stallions must be shown in a bit.

Relevant classes are qualifiers for STARS Champion of Champions to be held at Aintree in November 2024. To qualify for STARS, you must be an ADRC member and must be the overall points champion across the season.

In the event of cancellation, entry fees will be refunded minus the £1.50 booking fee. No refunds will be made to withdrawals after close of entries.

No horse or ponies to be left unattended unless correctly secured inside a horsebox or trailer. Please do not muck your horse boxes or trailers out on the field and take any litter home with you.

The judges and steward's decisions are final.

If riding between the warm-up arena and the show arena this must be done so in walk and in the designated horse walks. Jumping of the cross country jumps on the field is prohibited at club shows.

Neither the committee nor anyone acting on their behalf accept any responsibility for any loss, damage or injury, howsoever caused.

Spectators are most welcome at all our events, but are requested to keep clear of all horse and pony areas and access routes and avoid behaviour which may alarm horses. Dogs are allowed if kept on a lead at all times and can behave appropriately. Please clean up after your dog.

The organisers have the overall responsibility for Health and Safety at our events. With this in mind, each competition is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation

Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health, safety and welfare of those attending the events

For these measures to be effective, each individual must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and conduct themselves in such a way that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk. They must therefore obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards at all times

In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or dial 999. Emergency Services must have access to all parts of the show ground at all times. Vehicles must not be parked so as to obstruct access

Only The Club, its members and helpers are covered by third party insurance whilst taking part in Atherstone and District Riding Club activities. We would advise all riders to become British Horse Society Gold Members as this will provide them with third party insurance for all horse related activities.
